

## **Uwe Kitzinger**

*Uwe Kitzinger CBE was elected President of the Oxford Union in 1950 and worked as the first British economist of the Council of Europe in Strasbourg until 1956 when he was elected a Fellow (and from 1962 an Investment Bursar) of the College. To promote research on contemporary Europe in English-speaking universities in 1963 he founded the Journal of Common Market Studies. He held Visiting Professorships at Harvard and Paris and in 1973-75 served in Brussels as the Political Adviser to the first British Vice-President of the European Commission.*

*He resigned his Fellowship in 1976 to become Dean of the European Institute for Business Administration (INSEAD) in Fontainebleau. Returning to Oxford he championed Management Studies in the University and after negotiating its foundation in 1984 became the first President of Templeton College. From 1993 to 2003 he was a Visiting Scholar at Harvard and is now an Honorary Fellow of Green Templeton.*
